

Supervised Quarantine and Isolation Eligibility for Admission to Medi-Hotel

Under supervised quarantine and isolation arrangements, COVID-19 positive patients with more complex care and social needs can be accommodated in a Medi-Hotel, providing Hospital in the Hotel based care, including 24/7 nursing care, if they meet the inclusion criteria.

Inclusion criteria	Exclusion criteria
<p>A person who meets any of the following inclusion criteria, may be eligible for admission to a Medi-Hotel for the duration of their quarantine or isolation period:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The person is COVID-19 positive and meets the eligibility criteria for assistance into emergency accommodation under Housing SA's <u>Emergency Accommodation policy</u>, but has not linked into Housing SA or other Emergency Accommodation Provider (for example those included on the <u>Homeless Services Provider Directory</u>). This includes individuals impacted by domestic violence. • The person is COVID-19 positive and does not have access to adequate accommodation (e.g. they are sleeping rough or living in their car) and has not been able to access other accommodation support services due to their COVID-19 positive status. • The person is an international, unvaccinated traveller who has not nominated a suitable residential address to complete their mandatory quarantine period on their exemption application and has been directed by an authorised officer to quarantine at a Medi-Hotel. • The person is COVID-19 positive from a rural or regional location and is unable to isolate and is unable to access alternative quarantine, including an Alternate Regional Quarantine Facility. 	<p>Persons living in congregate living arrangements or extended family households are not considered eligible for admission to a Medi-Hotel, unless they meet other inclusion criteria.</p> <p>The following persons are not suitable for admission into a Medi-Hotel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • COVID-19 positive persons requiring emergency or acute care. • COVID-19 positive persons requiring significant assistance with mobility or activities of daily living, including residential aged care residents. • COVID-19 positive patients with significant behavioural issues. • COVID-19 positive patients with significant cognitive impairment. • COVID-19 positive patients with an acute or unstable chronic mental health issue that may be exacerbated by the Medi-Hotel quarantine environment, for example claustrophobia. • COVID-19 positive persons who are unlikely to be able to complete their isolation or quarantine in a Medi-Hotel due to medical risk factors. • COVID-19 positive persons who are actively withdrawing from drug or alcohol dependence. • COVID-19 positive persons detained or imprisoned in a City Watch House or a Correctional Facility. • COVID-19 positive persons detained in Immigration Detention.
